

## IN MEMORIAM

JOHN ALTRINGER, ONE OF WIMBLEDON'S OLDEST AND MOST RESPECTED CITIZENS DIED SUD- DENLY.

On Tuesday of this week, June 16th, occurred the death of John Altringer following an illness of only a few hours, his death being due to heart failure.

John Altringer was born in Sulm, Germany, March 1st, 1831; and made his home in this vicinity in 1886. He was respected by all who knew him, honest and just and his memory will be held sacred by his many friends.

The funeral took place this morning from the temporary Catholic church. Under the impressive Catholic ceremonies a Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Father Bierens, who afterwards in well chosen words pictured the deceased as our greatest citizen whose departure the whole community deeply regretted; as a true and faithful Catholic in whom the St. Boniface parish loses its most perfect member; as a family father who has successfully closed a life dedicated to duty and as a faithful husband of exemplary devotedness to his wife and family.

With him is gone a prominent figure of our community, but the memory of "Grandpa" Altringer will still linger long in the minds of his many children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren and of the numerous friends of this large and prominent family.

Our full sympathy is with the widow of the deceased upon whom the loss falls most heavily as she was united to him in a happy union for almost 50 years.

The Rev. Father Sailer, a former rector, assisted at the funeral.
