Klein at Rossvile, Iowam Six children were born to them, one dying in infancy, the other five and Mr. Klein being present at the funeral. The children are Rev. George Klein, Valley City; Rev. C. F. Klein, Countenay; E. P., Ralph and Miss Gertie E. Klein of Binford and an adopted baby, Glen Klein.
