

## MAN FOUND DEAD AT JAMESTOWN

BOY DISCOVERS BODY OF UNKNOWN MAN NEAR FAIR BUILDINGS AT JAMESTOWN.

Jamestown, Jan. 18—The dead body of a stranger, a man about 45 or 50 years of age was discovered this noon lying on the south side of the large exhibition building at the fair grounds. From the evidence gained this far, previous to the inquest, it appears that death was due to some violent disease as there was froth around the mouth and over the face of the deceased man.

Joseph, the 15-year-old son of Frank Andre, discovered the body, while gathering driftwood along the river with Fred Nesson. When they found the man was dead, the boy ran up town and informed the sheriff, who with the states attorney and Justice Bigelow, went down to take charge of and examine the remains, which were brought to the undertakers to await the inquest.

The man was poorly dressed in a rather light laboring man's suit, and in the clothes were found a first-class railroad ticket from Mandan to Minneapolis, made out to Pat Burns. The ticket had been purchased the 16th or Thursday, so it seems that the man came in from Mandan Thursday and got off at Jamestown, and either very sick or under the influence of liquor, wandered to the fair grounds, where he died. Other articles found on the remains were two cheap watches, but 10 cents in change, a couple of note books with the name of Pat Burns inscribed on the flyleaf, and the address Marquette, Mich., probably the unfortunate man's home. Other names and addresses were written in the book. Coroner Todd has been notified and will arrive this evening.
