

## YOUNG MAN INJURED BY PASSENGER TRAIN

HE WAS HURLED AGAINST THE  
PLATFORM AT WIMBLEDON AND  
HIS SKULL FRACTURED.

A frightful accident happened near the depot this morning when east bound passenger train 108 struck Robert Deveaux and threw him against the platform, seriously, if not fatally injuring him.

The boy is 14 years of age and lives with his parents on a farm near Wilson postoffice in Kidder county. He has been employed as a chore boy on Louis Altringer's farm north of town for several weeks and this morning was going to Cathay, where his father has work in the harvest fields. He purchased a ticket and got on west bound train 105, which was on the passing track waiting for east bound train 108, but had forgotten his grip and when returning to the depot to get it, was struck by the incoming train. He did not see the approaching train and was running along on the main line toward the depot when the engine struck and threw him against the platform, fracturing his skull and badly bruising his face and shoulders. Dr. Wanner was immediately called and the boy taken to the office where a thorough examination of his wounds was made. He was then taken to the Hotel Glidden and given every attention. He rested quite well throughout the day and the doctor hopes of his recovery. His father arrived this evening from Cathay and accompanied his son to the hospital at Enderlin.—
