Killed by Lightning On Saturday, July 13, August D., son of Mr. and Mrs. Fredrickson, was struck by lightning and instantly killed on his father's farm three and one half miles south of Kensal. His clothing was entirely torn from his body, the rubber soles of his shoes alone remaining intact; even his hair being somewhat singed. The boy was but a short distance from his father and a farm hand, both of whom were prostrated by the shock, but who soon recovered to find the boy dead. A deep hole had been torn in the ground where the boy had stood, showing plainly the marks of the lightning's terrible force. The remains of the unfortunate boy were laid to rest in Union cemetary at Kensal Monday, July 15, from the Congregational church, Rev. E. L. Kelly officiating and preaching an able and instructive sermon. '-Kensal Journal
