

# THE COMMERCIAL CLUB

**Was Organized On Monday Evening of This Week  
and Already Several Projects Are Under Way.**

There was a good attendance at the meeting in Dr. Macdonald's hall last Monday evening to discuss the matter of organizing a commercial club in Courtenay and all who attended seemed to be agreed that it would be the proper thing to organize and this was done by electing S. V. Weiser president and Loran Nichols secretary. Those present were called on for remarks regarding the benefits to be derived from an organization of this nature and some good ideas were brought out in the talks, which were all from a business standpoint. C. W. Hensel, J. A. Coffey and H. N. Tucker were appointed as a committee on constitution and by-laws and will report at a meeting to be held this evening when the organization will be perfected.

Already the secretary is in correspondence with parties in Minnesota who are desirous of locating here and engaging in the flouring mill business. This is an enterprise which the town very much needs and it is to be hoped that some good reliable company can be induced to locate. An enterprise of this nature is a trade puller for the town and is a benefit to the whole community farmer and business man as well. There are also some other enterprises under consideration and it is expected that in a short time many more will be taken up for consideration and no doubt great good will result.

This is one of the best business moves that the town has made for some time and if the club is a success, which it undoubtedly will be, it will give the town a standing in the business world such as it never had before. That the town is capable of transacting a large volume of business is a well established fact and it is capable of giving strong support to some important enterprises and with the push and enterprise of a good live commercial club the town's chances for forging to the front in the business world were never brighter than at the present time.
