

BOARDING WITH SHERIFF

G. W. FARRIS IS NOW BOARDING WITH SHERIFF WAS SFR CHARGED WITH SELLING LIQUOR CONTRARY TO LAW.

The way of the transgressor is hard. This is the way G. W. Farris feels about his lot. Last week Thursday the sheriff and the state's attorney came up from Jamestown and gathered in Mr. Farris on a complaint sworn to by Marshal Walker charging him with selling intoxicating liquor contrary to law. He had his preliminary hearing before Justice Bouer on Friday and was bound over to the district court and his bond fixed at \$2,000. This he was unable to raise and he is now boarding with the sheriff.

The trouble was started over the arrest of B. Hotchkiss on a similar charge. After Mr. Hotchkiss was taken to Jamestown he informed the state's attorney that there were others in Courtenay who were engaged in the same illegal business and named Mr. Farris as one of them. The marshal, who had taken Mr. Hotchkiss to Jamestown, then swore out the complaint and the sheriff and state's attorney returned to Courtenay with him.

During the hearing of Mr. Farris several parties swore that they had bought beer of him and paid for it at the rate of 25 cents per bottle. The evidence seemed to be strongly against him and there was nothing left for the justice to do but bind him over.

This ought to be a warning to others who are tempted to engage in the business on account of the financial gain it brings.
