

The Gazette is in receipt of a letter from John Raab who went to the Argentine Republic last fall as a representative of the McCormick Harvester Company. He arrived at Buenos Ayres on December 7, having been on the water 26 days. They had very nice weather but rather hot while crossing the equator and along the Brazilian coast. The temperature there now is about the same as in North Dakota in June. They are just beginning to harvest their wheat and flax and have a fine crop, the wheat going about 40 bushels to the acre. They also raise quite a number of cattle and sheep, most of which is shipped to England. They very seldom have frost in that country and they raise all kinds of fruit and vegetables.
