

## RAISED CHECK FROM \$5 TO \$50

CHARLES RHOADES WHO WORKED ON A FARM NEAR COURTENAY DURING THE FALL GOT IN TROUBLE AT FARGO AND IS BOUND OVER TO THE DISTRICT COURT.

Charles Rhoades who worked on a farm near Courtenay during the fall evidently thought he had not made money enough and when he got to Fargo raised a check from \$5 to \$50 and was bound over to the district court on Saturday on a charge of forgery preferred by Matt Seigel of Fargo.

Mr. Rhoades purchased some clothing at Mr. Seigel's store and in payment gave a \$50 check. Mr. Seigel noticed after an examination that the check had been raised from \$5 to \$50 and at once went in search of Rhoades and with the assistance of the Moorhead police he found his man in the Arcade saloon. He was placed under arrest and taken back to Fargo and was given his preliminary hearing on Saturday before Judge Ryan. He had no defense to offer and the work on the check was so coarse that it was easily detected. As district court is now in session he will not have long to wait for his trial.
