

## BODY FOUND

### AT WAHPETON

EVIDENCE INDICATES THAT ALBERT MOE WAS KILLED FOR HIS MONEY.

Wahpeton, N. D., April 4. — What will might end in one of the worse crime ever perpetrated in Richland county was brought to light last night. Boys playing along the Red River near the sand-bar at the wagon bridge, found the decomposed body of a man entangled in the weeds and grasses and endeavored to pull it on shore. The body proved to be that of Albert Moe of Fergus Falls, who was foreman on the great Johnson farm near this city. Moe was last seen last fall at Breckenridge. He came to town with considerable money on his person and started drinking in company with a bunch of thugs.

From the condition of the body he was enticed near the river where he was attacked, knifed and beaten to death. An examination shows a knife wound in the chest and the head was crushed, evidently with the same blunt instrument. The pockets of the dead man's clothes were rifled and all the cash as well as a gold watch taken.

Death was pronounced as being due to a knife wound and a blow on the head. The police have a clue and are working on the case.
