RUSSELL MORE KILLED UPPER FLOOR HEAVILY LADEN WITH SHELLED CORN CAUSES u d SERIOUS DISASTER. e ad Late last night the news reached here by telephone that the upper floor in the warehouse of More Bros. at Fargo gave way and killed Russell More and his bookkeeper, whose name could not be learned instantly. Mr. More, who was sitting in his office chair at the time of the accident, was terribly crushed and t death no doubt was instantaneous. A Mr. Bell, a son of C. I. Bell of Wimbledon, miraculously escaped without injury. No further particulars could be learned than that the upper floor of the warehouse, on which was stored a large amount of shelled corn, gave way to the weight and buried the unfortunate men underneath the debris. A later report stated that another man by the name of Jarvis was missing but it was not definitely 1 known whether he also became a victim of the falling timbers or whether he had been absent from the building at the time the accident occurred. John and A. Y. More, of Wim-1 bledon, brothers of the deceased, left at once after the news reached them for Fargo to look after 1 the remains of the unfortunate victims of the disaster.
