
AUTHORITIES PUZ- ZLED BY QUEER CASE

**HABITS OF WALSH COUNTY MAN
FOUND IN BARN ARE SOME-
WHAT PECULIAR.**

Edinburg, N. D., May 15.—Ole Peterson drove in from Dundee township and informed Marshal Sundvor that a strange man had been found in a vacant barn near the place of John Marifjern having every appearance of being in a demented condition. Marshal Sundvor together with O. K. Saltvold drove to the place and brought the man to town. He impressed one as being a fugitive. He was in tatters and long and unkempt hair gave him a savage look. He was placed in jail and was brought before Justice Northfield, giving his name as Matt Hill, and saying that he came from Crookston, where he had served ninety days for drunkenness. He was given five days in the county jail on a charge of vagrancy and was taken to Grafton by Marshal Sundvor and G. C. Jensen. The five days' sentence will bring to light whether he is insane or not. The county authorities took hold of the matter at once and are investigating the case.
