He and his faithful wife have stuck to the farm and the reward for their work is evident to themselves as well as neighbors and others. Mr. Fosberg lives east of Jim Lake. He sold a car of fat stock this fall and has 65 head left and 16 head of horses with all the necessary farm machinery. He says he has no kick coming on North Dakota.—Alert.
