

Rev. Baldwin Dead

Rev. Winfred Baldwin of Jamestown passed to the great beyond on Wednesday morning at eight o'clock after an illness of about three weeks which confined him to his bed most of the time. For several years he has been a sufferer from stomach trouble which would not yield to treatment and he was compelled to give up his ministerial work some time ago. His strength has gradually been undermined by the disease and for the past few months his family and friends have noticed a rapid decline.

Rev. Winfred Baldwin was born at North Blenheim, New York, on February 11th, 1851, and came to this state in 1889. He was one of twelve children in the family, his brothers Fredrus and Dorman being well known in this locality. He was a graduate of the New York Conference Seminary and the Boston Institute of Theology and for eleven years held ministerial charges in the state of Maine. After coming to this state he was stationed at Jamestown, Minot, Sheldon and Grandin, and since he was compelled to abandon the work has made his home at Jamestown where he has assisted his brother Dorman in his office and store work. He was a member of the Masons, Odd Fellows, Foresters and Woodmen and the funeral was held yesterday under the auspices of the Masonic order.

Besides his wife and one son and his brothers he leaves a host of friends to mourn his demise.
