

Married—At Oberon, N. D., May 31, 1896, by the Rev. O. P. Champlin, Tiwaste* Young and Tunkankeiyo-tonkewin (Sitting-With-Stone-Girl), all of the Ft. Totten Indian reservation. The bride, a widow, with a boy two years old, was baptized into the christian faith just prior to the marriage ceremony. Her age is seventeen years. The groom—forty-three years of age, is a christian Indian. The ceremony was performed at the parsonage. A lunch was served afterwards—the bride taking hers outdoors at the wagon. The witnesses were Charles W. Shielde, who acted as interpreter, and Job Twohearts. Samuel Tiwaste buried his wife sometime last year.
