

Sad Drowning.

Friday afternoon Mrs. James Foley the wife of Editor Foley of Bismarck was drowned at Duluth. The deceased was an only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. S. Beardsley of Bismarck and was about twenty-two years of age, and was married to Mr. Foley about three years ago. The lady was visiting friends in Fargo last week and left Tuesday for St. Paul and from there she went to Duluth. On the fateful day she went down to the docks with a party of friends to see the boats come in. A switch engine backed down onto the docks and Mrs. Foley in stepping aside to avoid it, slipped and fell into the water. The fireman of the engine jumped into the lake and made gallant efforts to save her without success and the body was not recovered for an hour though it is said that the water was only five feet deep. Yesterday morning the bereaved husband and parents passed through the city on their way to Duluth and will bring the remains back to Bismarck for burial on Monday.

Mrs. Foley was raised in Bismarck and was highly esteemed by all who knew her. The sympathy of the Fargo friends of the deceased is extended to the bereaved husband and parents —Argus.
