Death of James W. Wilson. James W. Wilson who lived

about seven miles north of Courtenay died on Monday of this week shortly after noon.

He had been ill but a short time with typhoid fever of a severe type and died of heart failure due to sepsis.

James W. Wilson was born at Uxbridge, Ontario county, Canada, on July 17th, 1865. In the spring of 1885 he came to North-

Dakota and was one of the first settlers in Corinne township, Stutsman county, where, at his death, he owned 780 acres of land nearly all under cultivation, with fine buildings and all the necessary stock and machinery. He came here with nothing but thorough persistent energy he accomplished more than the ordinary man accomplishes.

His father, Samuel Wilson, died in the year 1878 but his mother still survives. He also leaves four brothers, Howard and Henry Wilson who reside here, Harrison Wilson at Daulphin, Manitoba, and Charles Wilson at Tacoma, Wash. Four

sisters, Mrs. Jennie Wilson who resides here, Mrs. Mary Lundy and Mrs. Alberta Taylor who reside at Daulphin, Manito-
