

Edward S. Berg died in this village last Saturday evening, Oct. 27th, at 10:30 o'clock, as the result of a paralytic stroke. He had been working for Ingebrit Simenson, and was with the ~~threshing crew at Olaf Christopherson's place near Sutton~~ when he was stricken in the night. He was able to talk and move a little Saturday morning, and arrangements were made to take him to Hannaford on the train in the afternoon. He was taken to the hotel and was given the best of care and medical attendance, but he continued to weaken rapidly and died that same evening. He suffered from a similar paralytic stroke many years ago, but partially regained his health after an extended stay at a sanatorium in Norway. Of late years he has been making his home here in town winters and during the summer months has been working for farmers west of town. He was unmarried and of a very quiet, kindly disposition. He has a brother in Eau Claire, Wis.
