He says that the cost of living in Canada is not higher than in North Dakota, some things, like clothes, being considerably cheaper there. Board and lodging is practically the same price in Moose Jaw and Hannaford. Moose Jaw is a city of between 20,000 and 30,000 inhabitants, and building and improvements are going forward rapidly. Their street railway system has been in operation only about a year. The traffic is rather lively, the downtown streets in Moose Jaw being more congested than Broadway in Fargo. Canada has developed a great deal the past five years, and from present indications will continue to do so for some years to come.
