

Gopher Hunt.

At a meeting of the citizens held at the School House in Hope May 12th, it was decided to have a Grand Gopher Hunt on Wednesday, May 28th, 1890, to be participated in by all the residents of Colgate, Lincoln, Melrose, and Hope Townships. Mr. L. C. Day will have charge of the forces in Colgate, Dan Fuller in Lincoln, and C. V. Buss in Melrose Township.

C. G. Merriell, J. W. Wheeler and J. P. McMahon were appointed as the committee to count the scalps.

Hunting to be from Sunrise to Sunset, and scalps to be brought to Band Stand, Hope, and counted by committee as soon as possible after sunset.

The aim was to have a banquet to be given after the hunt by the losers, but that has been left until the night of the hunt, and will be decided then whether or not the banquet be had.

In this hunt Colgate, Lincoln and Melrose townships will be pitted against Hope, the winners to turn over their scalps to the losers, and all proceeds to go towards defraying expenses of banquet, if enough are taken to warrant.
