
—J. B. Honeyman, the bees gardener of the county, sent down by the mail carrier Thursday from his Sherbrooke garden another fine lot of vegetables. There were in this lot a sugar-beet weighing $9\frac{1}{2}$ pounds, 18 inches long, 17 inches in circumference; a rutabaga, weight $9\frac{1}{4}$ lbs., circumference $23\frac{1}{4}$ inches; an Early Aberdeen yellow turnip, weight 10lbs; four Carrots, 16 inches long, 11 inches in circumference; four parsnips, 30 inches long and 13 inches in circumference; two heads of cabbage, 36 inches in circumference. These vegetables were all raised from the seeds, and matured in three months and twenty-two days. Can anyone beat this record? And can any climate and soil compare with that of North Dakota and Steele county in the way of productivity? We are inclined to think that it cannot be beaten.
