

—Quite a lively time was experienced in town last Sunday morning. Some time during the first of the week a car loaded with a steam threshing outfit was set off in the yards at this place, with the legend printed in bright letters upon the property—"Made for the Pickert Farms, Pickert, N. D." Early Sunday morning a crew of men from the Pickert farm, accompanied by one of the Pickerts, arrived in town and commenced unloading the car. It seems that there was a misunderstanding upon the part of the house which sold them the outfit, the Minneapolis Threshing Machine Co., in regard to the settlement for the property, so, before unloading operations had proceeded very far, the general agent of the company appeared upon the scene and ordered operations to cease. No attention was paid to the order by the Pickert force, so the agent gave out an injunction against them, enjoining them from working on Sunday, which injunction was obeyed. The force came down the next morning to resume operations, but only to find that the car had been unloaded in the meantime and the threshing outfit in the care of the deputy sheriff. We have not heard whether the Pickerts will take action to regain possession of the outfit.
