
A Good Record.

James Savage, at present postmaster at Nebo, in Clifton township, was born in Scotland in 1842, removing with his parents to Canada in 1843, from which place he removed to Harmony, Indiana, where he resided until 1883, when he came to Steele county and took up a homestead in Clifton, where he has since resided. Mr. Savage's entire possessions when coming to Steele county consisted of 2 horses and two cows. At present he is the owner of a fine farm of 320 acres, has 4 horses, 14 head of cattle and the requisite implements to carry on his farming. A portion of Mr. Savage's crop for 1891 is yet in the stack, but 20 acres of wheat which he threshed yielded 45 bushels per acre. He oats yielded 50 bushels per acre.
