

## Weather Report.

Monthly meteorological summary of the North and South Dakota weather service, in co-operation with the U. S. Signal Service, for May, 1891:

Temperature: Monthly mean, 56.8; highest monthly mean, 64.7 at Milbank; lowest monthly mean, 52.6 at Etta Mine; maximum, 102 at Clark; minimum, 17 at Fort Buford; range for the states, 85; greatest local range, 74 at Clark and Napoleon; least local range, 43 at De Smet.

Precipitation: Monthly mean, 1.64 inch; greatest monthly, 3.55 inches at Clark; least monthly, .38 of an inch at Forestburg.

In the U. S. S. S. Monthly Review for March, 1891:

"Precipitation to equal or exceed, 10.00 was reported from 59 stations. Among the heavier monthly reports are, 15.50 inches, at Kosciusko, Miss.; 14.85 inches, at Diamond, Ga., and 14.16 inches, at Belmont, S. C."

"The heaviest Monthly snowfall was 61.00 inches, at Cumbres, Colo.; 51.89 inches, at Blue Knob, Pa.; 51.00 inches, at Summit, Cal.; 46.50 inches, at Alton, Kans., and 45.49 inches, at Marquette, Mich."

In the Chief Officer's Report for 1891:

"The greatest annual precipitation was 111.03 inches, at Delta, Cal. The least precipitation was .80 of an inch, at Hot Springs, Nevada."

Monthly summary for Riverdale for June, 1891:

Temperature: Month's mean, 66.7; highest daily mean, 86; lowest daily mean, 42; maximum, 94; minimum, 40; range, 54.

Precipitation: 3.03 inches.
