Regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners.

Present: Commissioners Pease, Curry and Schjeldahl and Commissioners-elect O. W. Williams and L. C. Day.

Meeting was called to order by the County Auditor.

Commissioner-elect L. C. Day and O. W. Williams were duly sworn and their oath of office filed according to law.

On motion Mr. J. P. Pease was elected chairman of the Board for the ensuing year.

Board of County Commissioners convened at 9 o'clock a. m. pursuant to adjournment. Present: Chairman Pease and Commissioners Day, Curry, Schjeldahl and Williams.

C. H. Williams was allowed \$1 36 from the Gopher Destruction fund for 34 gophers killed during the month of April 1891.

The petition of N. F. Rasmussen for rebate of taxes paid under protest on \$1000 00 credits assessed against him for the year 1890, and on which he claims a deduction for indebtedness was taken up and discussed. On motion the same was disallowed, the Board having no authority to grant the same.

Moved and ordered that the County Auditor be instructed to make out a statement to the State Auditor, as provided by chapter 102 Laws of 1891.

Moved and ordered that the County Auditor be authorized to issue refunding orders for amount of rebate of taxes on Hope lots paid under protest for the year 1890 in accordance with abatement order made by the State Auditor.

On motion the petition of S. J. Pound asking for a rebate of Dog tax paid for the year 1890, was rejected.

The petition and affidavit of C. W. Dawdy setting forth that he had lost a certain gopher warrant issued to him and asking that a new warrant be issued in lieu thereof, was, upon motion laid on the table.

On motion the bill of Thomas J. Baldwin, \$2 00, for posting election notices in Willow Lake Twp. was laid on the table.

On motion Dr. W. H. M. Phillip was appointed member of the Board of Insanity for a term of two years.

On motion George Murray was appointed member of the Board of Insanity for a term of one year.
