**Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.**

Sherbrooke, N. D., June 7th, 1890.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment.

Present: Commissioners Lewis Thompson, chairman; John P. Pease, Alexander Curry, Martin Hanson and L. C. Day.

The minutes of the meeting of May 16th were read and approved.

On motion the order for seed wheat given to Charles Krall was cancelled and his contract was ordered taken from the records.
