Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.

SHERBROOKE, November 15th, 1889.

Special meeting of board of county commissioners met pursuant to call of County Auditor for the purpose of certifying to the annual county tax list and such other business as may properly come before the board.

Present commissioners Oxton, Nelson, Hanson and Day.

Oxton in the chair.

Moved and ordered that the bond of Watson A. Winslow, Clerk of the District Court, be approved and accepted.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from general fund, viz:

Beldier & Robinson Lumber Co., lumber and shingles for repairing roof of county building, \$45.84; 1,450 lbs. hard coal, \$7.25; total, \$52.59.

L. N. Wood & Co., 20 tons hard coal at \$10.75 per ton, per contract, \$215.00.
