Your committee appointed for the purpose of purchasing voting booths for the County submit the following report: After investigating the matter, we find that the patent booths advertised by various parties, are unnecessarily expensive and we will therefore recommend that the inspectors of election be instructed to put up in a corner of the rooms used for polling places, a blanket or other cloth sufficiently thick to prevent being seen through; and we also recommend that where the room is large enough a cheap railing or scuffling be placed across it, ten feet from the booth and Ballot box and in small rooms that the whole room be used as an enclosure for the booth and ballot box.
