Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.

SHERBROOKE, October 8th, 1889.

Adjourned meeting of the board of county commissioners met at 11 o'clock a. m.

Present commissioners Oxton, Day, Thompson and Nelson.

Oxton in the chair.

The minutes of the meeting of October 7th, were read and approved.

On motion the bill of Geo. T. McLean for bridge bolts amounting to \$4.00 was allowed and ordered paid from road and bridge fund.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from general fund, viz.;

Samuel Oxton, hauling six thousand shingles, Hope to Sherbrooke, \$2.

Foss & Erickson, supplies furnished Mrs. Hogfoss, pauper, 2.75.

F. E. Nests & Co., supplies furnished Mrs. Hogfoss, pauper, \$17.75.

Steele County Tribune, publishing proceedings and legal work \$65.55; and notice of election, \$23.45; total, \$89.

Griggs county, Steele county's proportion of expenses for holding court, June 1889 term, \$470.74.

On motion the board adjourned to 1.30 o'clock p. m.

Board reconvened at 1.30 o'clock p. m.

Present commissioners Oxton, Day, Thompson Nelson and Hanson.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from general fund:

Iver Jacobson, fees as district attorney of Griggs county in cases of W. B. Hench, and Arthur Herman of Steele county, \$20.

The bill of W. H. M. Phillip, amounting to \$51.50, for board of health expenses, was on motion laid on the table for correction.

The bill of W. H. M. Phillip, amounting to \$19.90 was on motion laid on the table for future consideration.

The bill of John J. Wamberg, Justice of the Peace acting as coroner, was on motion laid on the table to await decision of the district attorney.

The bill of J. M. Lane, for furnishing coffin and burying Andrew Anderson, pauper, was on motion laid on the table for future consideration.

The justice's report of D. E. Tufts, acting coroner, was on motion laid over awaiting the decision of the district attorney.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from general fund:

B. H. Nelson, 3 days as county commissioner and mileage, \$9.90. Total, \$12.60.

John Oxton, three days as county commissioner and mileage, \$9.90, and two days attending to the repair of the roof of the county building per order of the board, \$4; total, \$13.90.

L. C. Day, 3 days as county commissioner and mileage, \$13.80; one day visiting sick man at Hope, \$2; total, \$15.80.

Lucy Thompson, 4 days county commissioner and mileage, \$20; and one day over a pauper, \$3; total, \$18.

On motion the voting precincts for the election in commissioners' districts, two and to be held Nov. 5th, be the same as at the October election.

On motion it was ordered that \$10 a month be allowed Mrs. Petra Hogfoss, pauper, from October 1st, 1889, to May 1st, 1890.

The following was placed on the records:

John Oxton was authorized by commissioners Hanson and Thompson to shingle the roof of the county building before the same was done.

On motion the board adjourned.
