**Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.**

Sherbrooke, N. D., October 17th, 1891.

Board of county commissioners met in special session at 10 o'clock a. m., pursuant to call of county auditor.

Present: Chairman Hanson and commissioners Pease, Day, Curry and Schjeldahl.

The commissioners proceeded to sign the papers in the cases of the abatement of the personal property tax of E. D. Wallace, and the unpaid taxes, and taxes paid under protest in the original townsite of Hope for the year 1890.

On motion the county Auditor was directed to advertise in the Steele County Tribune all the lands and town lots in Steele county on which the taxes for the year 1890 have not been paid, excepting the town lots owned by the county.

On motion the board adjourned until 1 o'clock p. m.

Board reconvened at 1 o'clock p. m. Present, all members.

On motion the bill of Beldler & Robinson Lumber Co., \$33.60, for lumber for the Primrose bridge, was allowed and ordered paid from the bridge fund.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from the general fund:

On motion the application of S. J. Axdahl for the lease of lot 18, in block 6, Sherbrooke, for a term of three years, was granted, and a lease ordered executed on his payment into the county treasury of the sum of \$6.00.

The following resolution was on motion adopted:

Whereas, it appears that the chairman of supervisors for Hope township is a resident of the incorporated town of Hope, and cannot act as inspector of election of Hope township, therefore be it

Resolved: That Mr. Watson E. Bolze be, and hereby is, appointed inspector of election for said township of Hope for the election to be held November 3rd, 1891.
