Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.

Sherbrooke, N. D., October 1st, 1890.

Board of county commissioners met in special session, pursuant to call of Auditor.

Present: Commissioners Thompson, Hanson, Pease and Day. Mr. Thompson in the chair.

Hope, polling place at school house in the village of Hope.
