Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.

SHERBROOKE, STEELE Co. Sept. 2, 1889.

Board of commissioners met pursuant to law to make annual tax levy. Present Commissioners Oxton, Day, Nelson, Thompson and Hanson. Oxton in the chair.

Moved and ordered that a levy of three mills be made for general county fund.

Moved and ordered that a levy of 5-10 of a mill be made for road and bridge fund.

Moved and ordered that a levy of 6-10 of a mill be made for interest fund.

On motion the board adjourned.

SHERBROOKE, September 2, 1889.

Board of county commissioners met pursuant to call of county auditor for the purpose of locating voting precincts for the election to be held October 1st, 1889, auditing vouchers now on hand, and such other business as may come before the board.

All members present.

Oxton in the chair.

On motion the voting precincts for the election to be held Oct. 1st., 1889, are to be the same as at the election held May 14, excepting in the towns of Golden Lake, Norman and Greenview, which are to be as follows:

Golden Lake—At the home of O. W. Williams, on section 22, in said township.

Norman township—At school house on section 14 in said township.

Greenview township—At school house on section 28 in said township.

Moved and ordered that John Oxton be authorized to attend to the repairing of the roof of the county building.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from general fund:

Bugbee Bros., livery to go after carpenters to fix roof, \$1.00; cleaning hall, \$1.00; express and freight, 75 cents; total, \$2.75.

M. L. Michaels, sheriff, Griggs county, boarding Arthur Herman, Steele county criminal, 17 days at 75 cents per day, \$12.75.

John Syverson, Cooperstown, supplies for Arthur Herman, Steele county, prisoner, by order of Sheriff Michaels, \$5.25.

C. G. Huntley, salary for July and August, \$186.50.

C. G. Huntley, postage from May 1st to September 1st, \$2.25; cash advanced for express, \$1.75; making certified copies of proceedings from June 15th, 1888, to May 14th, 1884, inclusive, and making copies of stubs, for District Attorney Paul, \$10.00; total, \$14.00.

Hope Pioneer, publishing proceedings July 1, 2, 6 and 8th publishing statements and notice of teachers's examination, \$54.91.

L. C. Day, 1 day county commissioners, \$3.00; mileage, \$1.60; 1 day inspecting bridge, \$2.00; \$6.60.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from the road and bridge fund:

H. V. Ryther, building Rugg bridge, per contract, \$25.00.

H. V. Ryther, bill of \$5.00 for extra work at Rugg bridge, allowed \$4.00.

Beldler & Robinson Lumber Co., lumber for Rugg bridge, \$39.27.

Moved and ordered that the auditor advertise for bids for 20 tons hard coal for use of county.
