

Body Found at Last.

Belton, Mont., June 2.—The remains of B. F. Egan, of the Great Northern railroad, who was lost in the mountains while hunting November 4, were recovered today.

The remains were in very good shape, decomposition having evidently started in but a very short time ago. There were no marks of violence and death evidently came from sheer exhaustion. All the dead man's accoutrements were found on or near him with the exception of his compass and gun. There is not even any suspicion of foul play and the theory is that Egan became lost and pushed forward until he fell from exhaustion. There was no evidence that he had been touched by any wild animals. The remains were brought to Kalispel. The funeral arrangements will be made later.
