J. E. Johnson, formerly conductor on the Sanborn & Cooperstown branch, and later roadmaster of the Sanborn branch and the James River Valley Branch of the N. P., died in Cooperstown last Monday of pneumonia; after a week's illness. The funeral occurred Wednesday, and a special train carrying prominent railroad men and personal friends of the deceased was run from Jamestown to Cooperstown. Mr. Johnson leaves a widow and several children to mourn their loss. Deceased stood well with his official associates and with the people of the community in which he lived. He had accumulated considerable property and owned at the time of his death a farm adjoining the village of Coopertown. He was a mason of high standing.
