

Death of A. A. Hoiland.

Brief mention was made last week of the death of Aadne A. Hoiland, an old and respected citizen of the county, who died at his home near Nome station on Tuesday, the 2d inst.

Aadne A. Hoiland was born August 12, 1825, near Stavanger, Norway, and was married to Miss Johanna Christoferson in the fall of 1853. They came to America the spring of 1854, and made their home near Dacorah, Iowa. Mr. Hoiland worked at his trade until the next summer and then moved to Arendahl, Fillmore county, Minn., where he bought a farm. He lived there nine years and then sold out, in 1864, and bought a farm in the town of Yacatan, Houston county. He farmed there until the spring of 1879, when he moved to Barnes county. Mr. and Mrs. Hoiland were the parents of eleven children, six boys and five girls. One son died when an infant. The surviving children are John Hoiland, Mrs. Alfred Zuger and Mrs. Harry Jones, of this city; Aadne Hoiland, jr., and Mrs. T. J. Walker, of Fort Ransom; Andrew Hoiland, of Eugene, Oregon; Albert and Anton Hoiland, of Fingal; Mrs. Robert Bowen, of Armstrong, Iowa, and Mrs. D. R. Flavin, of Litchville.

Mr. Hoiland's wife died in August, 1893, and his body was interred by her side in the cemetery at Oakville. There was a very large attendance at the funeral, which occurred last Friday.
