Another Barn Burned. . Sunday morning the barn of John Faust, about a mile east of Sanborn, was burned with its contents, including seven horses. Two lives were lost, Mr. Faust's son, age 12, and a boy named James Collins, age 16. The two boys and a bired man were sleeping in the barn at the time, the latter escaping by jumping t from a window. Mr. Faust 1 came out of the house and taking a ladder went to the window 1 in an endeavor to get the boys. 1 out. Reaching in he seized one of the boys by the wrist, but bef fore he could get the lad out the S floor gave way and the boys dropped into the flames. Mr. d Faust was badly burned about O the right arm, face and neck. 1 The origin of the fire is unknown, but as numerous barns of well-to-do farmers have been burned in this county within a short time, it is possible the e barn burner is again getting in V. his work. The sympathy of the T entire community is extended to ţ-Mr. Faust and Mr. Collins, the latter of whom has recently be-11 come a citizen of the county. n
