

## AN OLD SETTLER GONE.

Wm. Colville of Ashtabula, Who  
Came to Barnes County in 1880,  
Died Yesterday.

Yesterday morning about 4:30 o'clock, William Colville died at his home near Ashtabula, of typhoid pneumonia, aged 40 years and 8 months. Mr. Colville was taken seriously ill about ten days ago, his system having become exhausted from caring for Mrs. Colville, who had been dangerously sick with pleura pneumonia, and is now happily recovering.

Mr. Colville leaves besides his wife two children, 8 and 10 years of age. The funeral takes place from his late residence at 2 o'clock today, Rev. Frye of Dazey preaching the funeral sermon. The remains will be taken to his old home in Wisconsin for interment, accompanied by his sister, who was called to his bedside.

Mr. Colville came to Barnes county in the spring of 1880 and settled on a claim near Ashtabula, where he has since resided. He was an upright, progressive citizen universally respected by his acquaintances. Being industrious and frugal, he accumulated considerable property, and leaves his family in comfortable circumstances. He and his brother, David, were among the early settlers in the

northern part of the county, and have always been counted upon as good examples of what can be done in this part of the world.
