

Mrs. Hans Simensen Dies Suddenly

Appoplexy is Cause of Her Death

A gloom was cast over this community Wednesday evening when it was learned that Mrs. Hans Simensen had passed away after being stricken by appoplexy. She was entertaining Mrs. Anton Gilbertson and while sitting at the table having coffee about 5:30, Mrs. Simensen complained of feeling sick. She went to a couch to lie down, but almost at once she became unconscious. A physician was summoned but before he arrived her spirit had gone to its reward. She had been in her usual health, apparently, and only a few hours earlier, came up town to do some shopping.

Arrangements have been made to hold the funeral at the Methodist church Friday at 2:30, with Rev. Ordahl conducting the services.

Elizabeth Holt was born in La Cross county Wisconsin September 12, 1866, her age at death, October 2, 1929, being 63 years and 20 days. She was married to Hans Simensen at Minneapolis November 22, 1892 and after several years, 1905, came to Hannaford North Dakota. In 1910 they returned to Wisconsin for a year and then moved to Aneta. In 1915 they came to Sutton, which has since been the family home.

The members of the sorrowing family who survive are the husband; five children, Hazel, [Mrs. Frank Nelson] Portland Oregon; Arthur, Minot; Victor and Helen, at home, and Wallace, on U. S. battleship Grant, en route to the Philippines.

Other relatives are two sisters, Minnie Holt Brown of Vancouver and Mrs. Albert Saxrud of White Hall Wisconsin; two brothers, John Hold of Wisconsin and Ole Holt of Coeur d'Alene Idaho. There are also five nieces, Mrs. M. Greenland of Aneta, Mrs. Carl Fodness of Knox and Mrs. Cora Homalstad, Amanda and Hazel Saxrud of Wisconsin.
