Oscar Opheim, Ralph Solem and Esther Painter of Cooperstown were found dead from monoxide gas poisoning in a car a mile west of that city about eight o'clock Monday morning. The car had brokend own three hours earlier and the men walked to town to secure assistance. Not succeeding they returned to the car, and it is evident they started the engine to keep them warm, until daylight and then went to sleep from which they never wakened. The first party to pass them stopped and shut off the engine and tried to waken them but did not discover their real condition. Later, others in trying to rouse them found all dead. Oph iem was ball player and weare informed he played with the Sutton team several years ago.
