

Mrs. J. N. Urban

Friends in Griggs county and other vicinities were shocked last week at the news of the death of Mrs. John N. Urban, which occurred at Fargo about 7 o'clock last Wednesday evening. Mrs. Urban had for the past two years been unable to enjoy her usual good health and several times was in a Fargo hospital for treatment. Her last trip to the hospital was occasioned by a severe attack of quinsy. Her throat having been lanced and her complete recovery assured her physician permitted her to go to a hotel and make arrangements for returning home the next day. However, that night, as she and Mr. Urban were entering their room she was stricken by apoplexy, death following immediately.

Emma Karolina Urban was born in Dodge county Wisconsin November 8, 1882, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Mike Wild. In the year 1900 she was united in marriage to John N. Urban. Three years later they came to Cooperstown, remaining there two years when they moved to this community, which has since been their home.

During these periods of years a daughter and son, Valberga and Bert, arrived to make a happy and contented family.

Surviving are the husband and two children, Mrs. C. W. Fallen of Sutton, and Bert, also married, of Glenfield; two sisters, Mrs. Leland Rhodes of Coopers town and Mrs. John May of Stanley Wisconsin. Two sisters, Mrs. John Youngbeck and Mrs. John Ebentier, died within recent years.

Mrs. Urban was a woman with a quiet, unassuming nature, a devoted wife and mother, and one who was held in great esteem by all who knew her.

The funeral was held in the Methodist church at Sutton last Saturday, being conducted by Rev. Dwaschack of the Catholic church at Wimbledon.

Burial was in Hartman cemetery east of Sutton.
