

Geo. W. Kolpin of Sutton spent some time in town Wednesday. He was on his way home from St. Paul where he had been with a shipment of stock. Mr. Kolpin is the manager of the Sutton livestock shipping association and is handling practically all the stock shipped out of the Sutton territory. Shipments to the Farmers Union livestock Commission at South St. Paul are increasing right along, Mr. Kolpin stated, and the Farmers Union Terminal Association is getting more and more of the grain business of the farmers of the northwest. Mr. Kolpin is president of the Griggs County Farmers Union and as the object of the Union is to secure a fair price for farm products by means of selling through farmer owned selling agencies, he expressed great satisfaction over the steady growth of the Union co-operative selling agencies in the Twin Cities. If the volume of business handled by these farmer owned concerns continues to increase at the present rate, Mr. Kolpin stated, the time may not be so far distant when these concerns can demand and get cost of production for the farm products sold through them.—Hanford Enterprise.
