

# Horace Perkins To Citizens' Training Camp

Horace Perkins has been designated to attend the Citizens' Military Camp at Fort Lincoln, Bismarck, from August 1 to August 30, 1929.

These camps are held each year during the month of August. They are carried on by the Government as part of the plan of National defense. The Government provides food, uniforms, equipment, medical and dental care while at camp. Each candidate must pay his own railroad fare to camp. However, on the day he arrives at camp, he will be reimbursed at the rate of five cents per mile. Tickets will not be furnished. Travel allowances at the rate of five cents per mile for the return journey will be paid candidates prior to departure from camp.

The camps are for boys between the ages of 17 and 24. The great aim of these camps is to stimulate and promote citizenship, devotion to country, comradeship, and team work, in order to inculcate in the candidate respect for and obedience to the laws and an appreciation of his rights and responsibilities as a citizen.
