Wins Prize

Although Griggs County may not win the Elsie Hadley-White Cup as the result of its Christmas Seal sale campaign, still it cannot help but feel proud of the record made. The 5c per capita aim set was \$370 10. The net receipts were \$406 00. Last year's total was \$282 08 which means an increase of \$123 92 over that amount this year.

At the outset of the campaign it was decided to give a prize to the school which raised its seal sales the most. The prize, which is a water-colored photograph of Theodore Roosevelt, was won by the Sutton school who increased their sales 147 per cent. The amount sold last year was 1421, the amount this year being 3513. Coopers town schools come second in the contest with an increase of 78 per cent. Their sale last year was 6777 seals; this year 12173 seals. The Hannaford school is third in the contest with an increase of a little over 25 per cent. Their sales last year amounted to 3768 seals; this year to 4731 seals.
