I have just returned home after spending five weeks in Iowa and Wisconsin, and I am going to give the public some impressions of these states from an agricultural standpoint, as they were received by me.

I was told by some that conditions in Iowa and Wisconsin are worse than in North Dakota. This is far from the truth and is nothing but bunk. I found in traveling through these states that on practically every farm there are from six to twenty milk cows, and that the cream checks range from \$30 to \$100 a month. In addition to this, on every farm there is a big flock of chickens and a big garden. The cows, chickens and gardens more than supply the owners with their living, which leaves for clear gain, profit, the income from the big crop, which is corn, hogs and steers.

It is true there is much land in Iowa, bought at the high mark which will never be paid for. Also the state contains plenty of people who think the world owes them a living without working for it, but that is not the fault of the country.
