

Last Sunday J. S. Byington had the misfortune to lose one of his fine purebred Shortborn cows, Maysville Beauty the 11th. She had been sick about a month, but no veterinary aid seemed to be sufficient to save the animal. During her breeding age of six years she raised six calves five of which have been sold for \$800, the last calf still in possession of the Byingtons. In the three times she has been sold, the amount of \$580 has been realized for her. She came from the E. C. Butler herd and Mr. Byington states that he will find it difficult to replace her. This speaks only too well for the Shorthorn industry and gives valuable reasons why more of them should be raised.
