

John Buckley, who for ten years has run as engineer on the Sanborn and Cooperstown branch of the Northern Pacific died of pneumonia on last Sunday at Cooperstown. He was only sick three days and it was a terrible shock to his friends when told of his death. He was very popular along the Northern Pacific line, of a sober, industrious and cheerful disposition; thirty-five years of age and unmarried. He was a member of the Brotherhood of Locomotive engineers and of the A. O. U. W. His remains were taken to Jamestown where his parents reside, and the funeral services were conducted on Wednesday morning at the pro-cathedral, after which his body was laid to rest in Calvary cemetery.
