KILLED AT LEAL

Young Man Found Dead Near Soo Line Tracks. Supposed to have Fallen From Moving train is the Corener's Verdict.

Roy Arnold, of Backus, Minu., is supposed to be the person who was found dead beside the Soo Line tracks at Leal.

About 6 o'clock Wednesday morning as the station agent at Leal was hanging up the mail pouch on the crane for east bound flyer No. 108, he noticed an object lying about 50 feet from the crane which he supposed to be the sack of papers from train 107 of the evening before, but upon investigation it proved to be the dead body of the young man as above stated. The agent informed Merchant F. P. Young, who immediately notified Coroner Pray

the body removed to the town hall. The coroner arrived on the afternoon freight and appointed F. P. Young, F. B. Smith and H. A. Hilborn as a jury, who rendered a verdict that the cause of death was unknown but it was presumed that it was a result of falling from

and permission was given to have

a moving train, as there was no marks to indicate foul play. One of his arms was broken in three places between the elbow and shoulder and he had a slight truise on one side of his head. He had \$15 dollars in currency and \$3.75 in silver on his person when found, also a memorandum book. He was about 18 years of age and his home is at Backus, Minn. The undertaker at Valley City took the remains in charge.
