

DEATH OF MRS. TAYLOR.

Sarah Wildman was born in Barkhamstead, Litchfield Co., Con., Jan. 16th., 1816; was married to Wm. S. Taylor, Feb. 2nd, 1841, came to North Dakota Oct. 4th., 1892; died Sept. 6th. 1903, at the age of 86 years, 7 months, 21 days.

Once again the Reaper of Death visits our community and claims for its victim Mrs. Sarah A. Taylor who died Sunday Sept. 6th '03 at the farm home of her daughter Mrs. U. W. Lantz, residing a few miles northeast of Wimbledon, at the age of 86 years, 7 months, 21 days. The deceased had been ailing for some time and her death was not unexpected. During her long illness the very best of care and medical attention was administered but she gradually weakened and at last death came and relieved her of all suffering. She was a kind and loving mother and had many warm friends. She leaves two children, a son S. P. Taylor, of Wolcotville, Ind., and the daughter with whom she spent her declining years. Her husband died March 20th, 1853.

Funeral services were held in the M. E. church Monday afternoon at two o'clock, Rev. A. M. Hewson preaching an impressive and comforting sermon. A large concourse of friends followed the remains to the Wimbledon cemetery, thus paying a final tribute to their departed friend and pioneer citizen.
