Monday evening. The Valley City Patriot has the following information: "All the family was out about the barn and Mr. Weiland and the hired man were sit-

ting on the door sill of the barn. Mr. Weiland holding the baby on his lap. When the lightning struck both he and the hired man fell over. His brother John ran to his aid, but life was extinct. The funeral of Mr. Weiland was held from St. Marys church, Dazey, this morning. Deceased

was 39 years of age, anative of Germany, and came to Barnes county in 1892. He leaves a wife and six children to mourn his death. He was widely acquainted throughout the county and highly regarded, and his sudden taking away is a sad shock to his loved ones and a large circle

of friends. Amund Feiber, the young man who was killed, was 19 years of age and a brother of Mrs. Julius Jahn of this city. His funeral was held from St. Catharines church, this city, today."
