Laid to Rest. Today occurred the funeral serl vices over the remains of little Orla Wellman, only child of Mr. 3 and Mrs. George Wellman residt ing northeast of Wimbledon. Tuesday morning the child got hold of a bottle of butter color and drank a small quantity of the contents before his mother had noticed him. He was taken suddenly ill and was brought to Wimbledon where Dr. Wanner was consulted and medicine given. The child appeared to improve and the parents started for home, but enroute he was taken worse and brought back to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Murdoch where he received every attention. The following day he seemed improving and it was thought out of danger. About 2 o'clock Thursday morning a change for the worse took place and at 4 o'clock death came to relieve him of his suffering. Orla was a very bright child of nearly 3 years and up to the time 1 of his last illness had never been afflicted in any manner. He was a general favorite with the neighbors in the vicinity of his home and the announcement of his death was received with great sorrow. The parents who are almost heartbroken, have the sincerest sympathy of the people of Wimbledon and vicinity. Rev. Nordimere, of the Presbyterian church of Courtenay, ducted the service which was very impressive and comforting. The remains were laid to rest in the Wimbledon cemetery at two o'clock this afternoon.
